



Environment and Outreach Intern

Permanent residents of Nova Scotia or students that have resided in the province for at least six months prior to the work term. Eligible applicants must be enrolled in a recognized post-secondary program on a full-time basis in Nova Scotia in Fall 2018.

Position Overview

Fundy Ocean Research Center for Energy (FORCE) is Canada's lead test centre for in-stream tidal energy research and technology. FORCE is seeking a highly motivated and dynamic student to assist with the delivery of programs relating to tidal energy development, environmental monitoring research, and oceanographic technology. Under the supervision of the FORCE Facilities Manager the Environment and Outreach Intern will assist with environmental monitoring study activities, participate in on-shore support for marine operations, provide interpretive services and delivery of public programs, and assist with daily operations at the FORCE Visitor Centre.

Specific activities of the Environment and Outreach Intern may include:

- Administer and complete shoreline monitoring and beach clean-up activities as well as support environmental monitoring study activities
- Prepare reports on shoreline and environmental monitoring activities
- Provide interpretive services and relay information to the public about tidal energy demonstration, site features and environmental monitoring program activities
- Participate in the delivery of educational programs and visitor services including conducting tours to groups of various sizes and responding to visitor inquiries
- Assist with general day to day operations including basic administration and cleaning activities

Position Requirements

- Prepared to work around tide times and in various types of weather and terrains including shoreline and intertidal zones
- Self-motivated team player with demonstrated ability to take initiative and work with minimal supervision
- Available and willing to work weekends and holidays and occasional evening/overnight work for onshore marine operational support
- A valid driver's license or ability to travel independently and reliably to the work site
- Participation in training specific to the position including First Aid and WHMIS if necessary (training expenses paid by employer)
